Natasha Stott Despoja says 1 in 5 women experience sexual violence.

Miranda Tapsell says That means each of us knows one of these women.

Tara Moss says I know one of these women. Me.

Ken Lay says No child enters this world dreaming of committing violence

Magda Szubanski says No man wakes up one morning and out of the blue murders his partner

Ruby Rose says The long road to family violence starts with a belief that women are possessions not equals.

Ken Lay says Most men are not violent. But the vast majority of acts of domestic and sexual violence are perpetrated by men against women.

Shane Jacobson says Our beliefs about the way boys and girls, women and men, are supposed to act are formed in childhood

Tasma Walton says Around the world gender stereotypes and unequal power between men and women are the most important underlying causes of family violence

Tara Moss says We can stop this before it starts.

Shane Jacobson says By saying no to attitudes, stereotypes and behaviours that support gender inequality and violence

Kelton Pell says We can help boys create more positive and healthier ways of being men.

Karen Willis says We have come a long way since the 70s. Violence against women is on the national political agenda. And incredible work currently goes on in our communities.

Tara Moss says But still, one woman is killed nearly every week by a male partner or ex-partner

Rosie Batty says The murder of children usually occurs in the context of domestic violence.

Stella Young says Extreme violence often occurs when the woman tries to leave the relationship...

Tasma Walton says And those who don't leave live with countless acts of violence everyday.
